Summer 2026 Programs

Enrichment Activities (STEAM Labs)

The Lompoc Teen Center offers daily enrichment activities designed to integrate Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics (STEAM) to foster critical thinking, creativity, and problem-solving skills in students.



Excursions

Excursions to local destinations and major attractions are offered throughout the Summer 2026 session. Additional fees may apply.



Leadership Fellows

Leadership Fellows are academically-achieving high school students who mentor and tutor students in the Yes I Can-Si Se Puede program. Fellows receive up to a \$5,000 post-secondary scholarship for up to three (3) years (228-hours) of community service in the Yes I Can-Si Se Puede program at the Lompoc Teen Center.



Programs

Pathways: A Summer Work Experience for Teens

Pathways: A Summer Work Experience for Teens is a 9-week paid internship program designed to help teens (incoming 10th-12th grade students) better prepare for college, career, and life beyond high school.



Reset Room

The Reset Room is a dedicated space at the Lompoc Teen Center that provides teens access to essential resources and a wellness space to practice self-care.

Resource Closet

The Resource Closet provides student members and non-members access to essential resources, including clothing, hygiene products, and school supplies.

Wellness Space

The Wellness Space provides student members a dedicated space to practice self-care.

Summer Camps

The Lompoc Teen Center partners with the [Firework Foundation](#) and the County of Santa Barbara to provide student members exclusive access to Camp Firework and the [Santa Barbara County Junior Lifeguard](#) program at no additional cost.

Camp Firework

Camp Firework is an overnight camp experience where students explore art, design, and self-expression through engaging projects and collaborative activities.



Santa Barbara County Junior Lifeguard

The Santa Barbara County Junior Lifeguard program is a fun and educational program that trains students with the skills required to be a Santa Barbara County Beach Lifeguard, including ocean rescue recognition and rescue techniques, use of a paddle board, first aid, and CPR.

Registration

Summer 2026 Registration

Parents/legal guardians may register their teen(s) in the Lompoc Teen Center in person at 732 N H St, Lompoc, California 93436 during regular Center hours or anytime [online](#).

Eligibility

Parents/legal guardians may register their teen(s) in the Lompoc Teen Center if their teen (7th through 12th grade) attend(s) an LUSD middle or high school or resides in the City of Lompoc.

Classification of Student Members

Classification	Description
Seventh Grade (7th)	Student members who are classified as seventh-grade (7th) students by LUSD.
Eighth Grade (8th)	Student members who are classified as eighth-grade (8th) students by LUSD.
Freshman (9th Grade)	Student members who are classified as freshmen (9th grade) students by LUSD.
Sophomore (10th Grade)	Student members who are classified as sophomore (10th grade) students by LUSD.
Junior (11th Grade)	Student members who are classified as junior (11th grade) students by LUSD.
Senior (12th Grade)	Student members who are classified as senior (12th grade) students by LUSD.
New Student Member	Student members who have never enrolled in the Center.
Continuing Student Member	Student members who are currently enrolled in the Center.
Returning Student Member	Student members who have enrolled in the Center, but have consecutively missed two or more regular academic terms.

Fees

Lompoc Teen Center Scholarship Fund

Lompoc Teen Center has made limited funds available to low-income LUSD students and Lompoc residents who desire and qualify to attend the Lompoc Teen Center, but who are prevented from doing so by the registration fee. The Fee Scholarship Program provides several ways to help teens from lower-income families pay the registration fee for the Lompoc Teen Center, including partial and full scholarships or payment plans. We are committed to making the Lompoc Teen Center accessible to all teens, regardless of their financial circumstances.

Summer 2026 Registration Fee

Teens who do not qualify for the Fee Scholarship program will be charged a \$50 registration fee for the Summer 2026 academic term.

Payment of Fees

Payment may be made by cash, check, or money order made payable to *Lompoc Teen Center*. The following policy applies when payment is made by personal check:

- Check is for the amount due only
- Must provide photo identification
- Imprinted checks only
- In-state checks only
- No personal two-party checks
- A non-sufficient funds check charge of \$25.00 (plus any bank charges) will be added to all returned checks

Refund Policy

Registration fees for student members who completely withdraw from the Center within ten (10) business days of initial registration fee payment(s):

- Petitions for reimbursement will be processed within five (5) business days of receipt by the Center
- No refunds will be given for complete withdraw after the first ten (10) business days from initial registration fee payment(s)

Student Member Code of Conduct

Zero Tolerance/Near Zero Tolerance Policy

Across the nation and specifically in the state of California, there is a continuing effort by lawmakers to treat violence, and acts that contribute to violence at school, with less tolerance. The Center aligns itself with Lompoc Unified School District, which operates in accordance with the law to demonstrate that violence in its schools will not be tolerated. Effective January, 1997, Assembly Bill 2720 provides for a “zero tolerance” procedure that school administrators are required to follow, which is adopted by the Center:

Zero Tolerance

The Executive Director or President shall immediately suspend from the Center, and shall recommend expulsion from the Center, a student member who commits certain acts at the Center or a Center sponsored activity off Center grounds. The Board of Directors must treat the following activities with “zero tolerance,” and will expel any student member who commits them, in addition to reporting the incident to the District:

- Possessing, selling, or otherwise furnishing any firearm (until it is determined to be an imitation firearm)
- Brandishing or pointing a knife at another person
- Unlawfully selling a controlled substance
- Committing or attempting to commit a sexual assault
- Possession of an explosive

Near Zero Tolerance

There are “near zero tolerance” offenses as listed below for which the Executive Director, at their discretion, may recommend expulsion to the Board of Directors. These acts may be committed at the Center or at a Center activity off Center grounds:

- Causing serious physical injury to another person, except in self-defense
- Possession of any knife, explosive, or other dangerous object
- Unlawful possession of any controlled substance, including drug paraphernalia containing residue, an alcoholic beverage, or an intoxicant of any kind
- Robbery or extortion
- Assault or battery upon any Center employee

Controlled Substance

California Law Health & Safety Codes lists numerous narcotics and dangerous drugs which minors may not possess or sell on any school campus. This code extends to after school and out-of-school centers in partnership with the District, including this Center. The extensive list of drugs includes prescription and over-the-counter substances. Student members in violation of zero & near-zero tolerance offenses regarding controlled substances, as noted above, may be subject to suspension and/or expulsion from the Center. Any student member who must take prescribed medication at the Center and who desires assistance of Center personnel must submit a written statement of instructions from the physician and a parental/guardian request for assistance in administering the physician's instructions. Center policy requires that any student member bringing medication to school shall have written instructions regarding its use and shall store the medication in the Center's office.

Student Member Searches

Center personnel may, with reasonable suspicion, subject a student member or their assigned locker, desk, and other related equipment, to a search for tobacco, drugs, and/or weapons without warrants. In an effort to keep the Center free of drugs, weapons, and other contraband, the Center may use metal detectors or specially trained, contraband/weapons-detection dogs to alert staff to the presence of substances prohibited by law, District, or Center policy. The dogs may sniff the air around lockers, desks, bags, items, or vehicles on Center property or at Center-sponsored events as long as the student member is not present. The administrator or staff will accompany the contraband-detection dog and the dog handler through the parking lot. Any items found that violate Center policies will result in disciplinary action and/or police or sheriff notification.

Police Investigations

In accordance with standards specified in law, law enforcement officers may interview and question student members on Center premises and may remove them when appropriate. At the law enforcement officer's discretion and with the student member's approval, the Executive Director or designee may be present during the interview. In addition, a student member age 17 or under must consult with an attorney before a custodial interrogation by law enforcement unless the interrogation is necessary to "protect life or property from an imminent threat" (Welfare and Institutions Code 625.6).

Release of Student Member to Peace Officer

If the Center releases your student member from the Center to a peace officer for the purpose of removing them from the Center premises, the Center official shall take immediate steps to notify you or a responsible relative of your student member, except when a student member has been taken into custody as a victim of suspected child abuse. In those cases, the peace officer will notify the parent or guardian (E.C. 48906; Penal Code 11165.6).

Harassment

In the school and after school center environment, harassment includes slurs, epithets, verbal abuse, derogatory comments or degrading descriptions based on race or gender. Harassment of this nature is specifically prohibited by Board Policies 5144.1 and 5131, and also by Education Code Section 212.5, by Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and by the Educational Amendments of 1972.

Sexual Harassment

The Center prohibits sexual harassment of any student member by any employee, student member, or other person in or from the Center. Sexual harassment includes unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other unwanted verbal, visual or physical conduct of a sexual nature.

Administration and Staff shall discuss this policy with student members in age appropriate ways and should assure them that they need not endure any form of sexual harassment.

Any student member who engages in the sexual harassment of anyone in or from the Center may be subject to disciplinary action up to and including expulsion from the Center, in addition to reporting the incident to the District. The Center expects student members or staff to immediately report incidents of sexual harassment to the Office Manager, Case Manager or Executive Director.

The Center prohibits retaliatory behavior against any complainant or any participant in the complaint process. Each complaint of sexual harassment shall be promptly investigated in a way that respects the privacy of all parties concerned.

Hate-Motivated Behavior or Harassment

Hate-motivated behavior is any act or attempted act against a student member or staff member that is motivated all or in part by hostility to the victim's race, ethnicity, religion, sex, ethnic group identification, race, national origin, ancestry, color, mental or physical disability, sexual orientation, or because a person is perceived to have one or more of the above characteristics. Complaints may be directly filed with the Executive Director.

Specific behaviors that are not tolerated by the Center include:

- Racial/Ethnic Slurs
- Vandalism to Personal Property
- Force or Threat of Force Through Outright Actions or Intimidation
- Vulgar Letters, Notes, Posters, or other Writings Offensive to Specific Races, Ethnicities, Religions, or Gender

Any student member who believes they have been harassed should immediately inform an administrator or staff. Complaints are required in writing and must include dates, issues, description of offending action, and names of individuals and witnesses involved. All complaints are confidential and will be reviewed and investigated through interviews geared to gathering factual information about the circumstances, the context, and the nature of the incident.

The Executive Director will prepare a written recommendation to resolve the complaint, and present it to the complainant and to the respondent. If either complainant or respondent is not satisfied with the proposed resolution, he or she may forward the complaint to the President, and if not resolved at that level, to the Board of Directors, whose findings will be considered final.

Bullying

Bullying includes but is not limited to bullying committed by means of an electronic act. Bullying in any form is considered serious and will not be tolerated. Student members who bully other pupils or Center personnel are subject to disciplinary action which may include suspension or expulsion from the Center.

The Board of Directors recognizes the harmful effects of bullying on student member learning and Center attendance and desires to provide a safe environment that protects student members from physical and emotional harm. Center employees shall establish student member safety as a high priority and shall not tolerate bullying of any student member.

No student member or group of student members shall, through physical, written, verbal, or other means, harass, sexually harass, threaten, intimidate, cyberbully, cause bodily injury to, or commit hate violence against any other student member or Center personnel. Cyberbullying includes the transmission of harassing communications, direct threats, or other harmful texts, sounds, or images on the Internet, social media, or other technologies using a telephone, computer, or any wireless communication device. Cyberbullying also includes breaking into another person's electronic account and assuming that person's identity in order to damage that person's reputation.

Strategies for bullying prevention and intervention shall be developed with involvement of key stakeholders in accordance with law, Board policy, and administrative regulation governing the development of comprehensive safety plans and shall be incorporated into such plans.

Bullying Prevention

To the extent possible, Center strategies shall focus on prevention of bullying by establishing clear rules for student member conduct and strategies to establish a positive, collaborative environment at the Center. Student members shall be informed, through the Center Catalog and other appropriate

means, of Center and District rules related to bullying, mechanisms available for reporting incidents or threats, and the consequences for perpetrators of bullying.

The Center may provide student members with instruction, at the Center or other educational settings, that promotes effective communication and conflict resolution skills, social skills, character/values education, respect for cultural and individual differences, self-esteem development, assertiveness skills, and appropriate online behavior.

Center staff shall receive related professional development, including information about early warning signs of harassing/intimidating behaviors and effective prevention and intervention strategies. Based on an assessment of bullying incidents at school, the Executive Director or designee may increase supervision and security in areas where bullying most often occurs, such as classrooms, hallways, restrooms, conference rooms.

Intervention

Student members are encouraged to notify Center administration or staff when they are being bullied or suspect that another student member is being victimized. The Executive Director or designee shall develop means for student members to report threats or incidents confidentially and anonymously.

Center administration and staff who witness bullying shall immediately intervene to stop the incident when it is safe to do so.

As appropriate, the Executive Director or designee shall notify the parents/guardians of victims and perpetrators. They also may involve the District, mental health counselors, and/or law enforcement.

Complaints and Investigation

Student members may submit to administration or staff a written complaint of conduct they consider to be bullying. Complaints of bullying shall be investigated and resolved in accordance with site-level grievance procedures.

When a student member is reported to be engaging in bullying off Center grounds, the Executive Director or designee shall investigate and document the activity and shall identify specific facts or circumstances that explain the impact or potential impact on Center activity, Center attendance, or the targeted student member's educational performance.

When the circumstances involve cyberbullying, individuals with information about the activity shall be encouraged to save and print any electronic or digital messages sent to them that they feel constitute cyberbullying and to notify an administrator or staff, the Executive Director, or other employee so that the matter may be investigated. If the student member is using a social networking site or service

that has terms of use that prohibit posting of harmful material, the Executive Director or designee also may file a complaint with the Internet site or service to have the material removed.

Discipline

Any student member who engages in bullying on Center premises, or off Center grounds in a manner that causes or is likely to cause a substantial disruption of a Center activity or Center attendance, shall be subject to discipline, which may include suspension or expulsion, in accordance with Center policies and regulations.

Progressive Discipline Policy

The following discipline guidelines will be used at the discretion of Center administration when decisions are made regarding individual student member incidents. These guidelines pertain to incidents which occur at the Center, going to or from the Center, and during or while going to or coming from a Center sponsored event or excursion. Center administrator's have the authority to impose progressive discipline steps to address student member behaviors.
